The regular meeting of the Riverside City Council was called to order at 6:00 pm by Mayor Pro Tem Tom Sexton with Council Members; Ryan Rogerson, Kevin Kiene, Lois Schneider and Kevin Mills present. Mayor Allen Schneider was absent.

Motion by Schneider, seconded by Rogerson, to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried 5-0.

TOPIC: Project Updates

#### Wellness Center

- Work Session to take place on October 27<sup>th</sup> and serve as the Town Hall Meeting prior to the upcoming bond vote.
- Axiom to meet with Amy Bouska (IDALS) on October 29th to discuss stormwater calculations and pre-application.

#### Cherry Lane

- Coordination has taken place regarding additional watering per council request. See additional memo from Axiom.
- Project has been completed, and Axiom recommends approval of Change Order No. 3 and Pay Application No. 4.

#### Hall Park Pickleball

- Axiom verified that D&N installed the correct materials; however, some of those materials (posts and rails) were damaged. D&N came back and replaced 4' fence top rail and repaired paint/surface issues to other posts and rails
- TSI came back to the site and completed touch up of playing surface paint following D&N fence repairs.
- Nolan's Landscaping was on site and set up watering (sprinklers) for seed due to lack of rain and grass growth.
- Beehive intake has been ordered, to be installed.

#### CDBG Downtown Revitalization

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# **ENGINEER'S REPORT**

**PROJECT:** Cherry Lane **DATE:** October 28, 2025

**TO:** City Council (c/o Cole Smith)

TOPIC: Watering

Per the request of City Council at the meeting on October 20, 2025, I have followed up with Stevens Erosion Control, the subcontractor responsible for the seeding and watering for the Cherry Lane project. As previously noted, and provided, Change Order #3 and Pay Application #4, we previously submitted for review and approval, which includes the final payment related to the watering deemed necessary for this project. At that meeting, City Council members questioned where this water came from, as well as the additional costs to water for the success of seed germination and achieving final stabilization, which I will address here.

Based on previous close-out and follow-up with City staff and City Council members on past projects, some of which we were involved in and others prior to, there has been a focus placed on the final seed or sod established at the time of project close-out. As a result, and to help alleviate any issues due to weather, lack of optimal topsoil, or other impacts, Axiom recommended the addition of a contract bid item for watering with the intent to ensure the City is receiving the final stabilization deemed appropriate and desired. This was a result of coordination/communication with various contractors and later discussed during the design process with City staff and council members prior to including in the contract documents.

Per SUDAS, this bid item is based on the number of trips provided by the contractor for the purpose of completing such watering within the project limits and area of disturbance which received seed or sod. In addition to the security of water being spread on the applied seed despite whatever weather we may see at that time, this also resulted in a lower unit cost for the seeding bid items as it provides less risk to the subcontractor and helps eliminate additional trips for potential re-seeding later in the project. This was proven by the unit price for seeding and has been verified by discussions with various subcontractors.

Due to the lack of rain, and exceptionally dry weather we received following the application of the hydro-seed and mulch for the Cherry Lane project, it was determined and approved by Axiom to initiate that watering process and utilize that bid item as intended so to get the results we are now seeing. Although it was discussed and noted at the pre-bid meeting that the City could provide water via a local/nearby hydrant if the subcontractor deemed necessary (w/ backflow preventer and meter), in following up with Stevens, they determined that due to the size of the area which needed to be seeded, it was more efficient and cost effective for them to fill their water tank at their office nearby in Hills, and water the site via such water truck rather than going through the process of connecting to the fire hydrant. Since it is not required for them to connect to the hydrant, but rather provided as a benefit, Stevens is not at fault for being out of compliance.

In terms of Change Order #3, and the request for \$2,000 for additional watering, this is based simply on the number of trips and duration of watering within the contract quantity and beyond. Again, this bid item is not based on the amount of water used or where that water comes from, but rather on the number of trips needed as the bid item includes water, equipment, transportation, etc.

In summary, I feel that the additional \$2,000 (~1% of contract value) was well worth the results of much faster site stabilization and a good-looking site with plush grass growth. Thus, I am recommending approval of Change Order #3 and Pay Application #4.

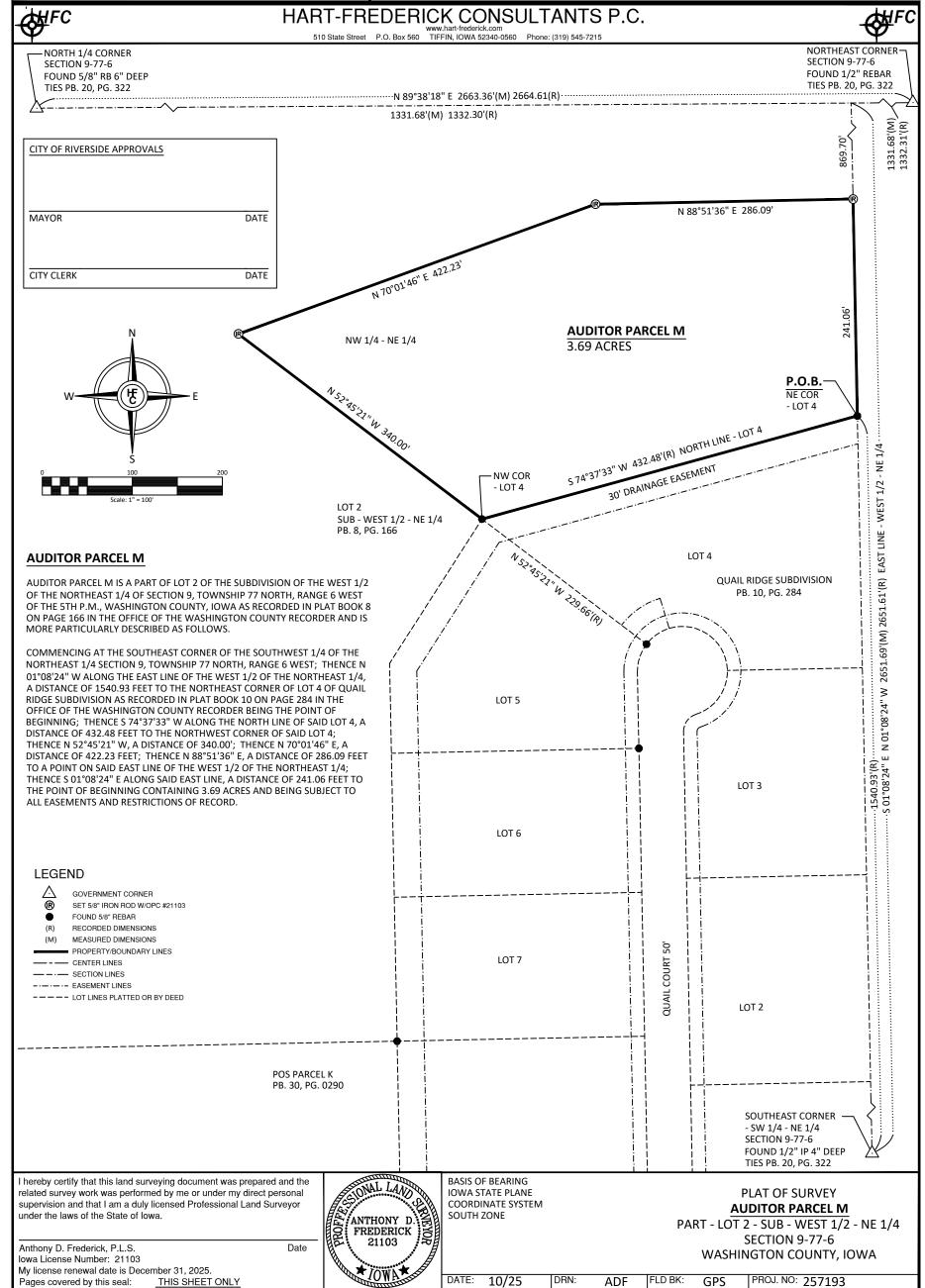

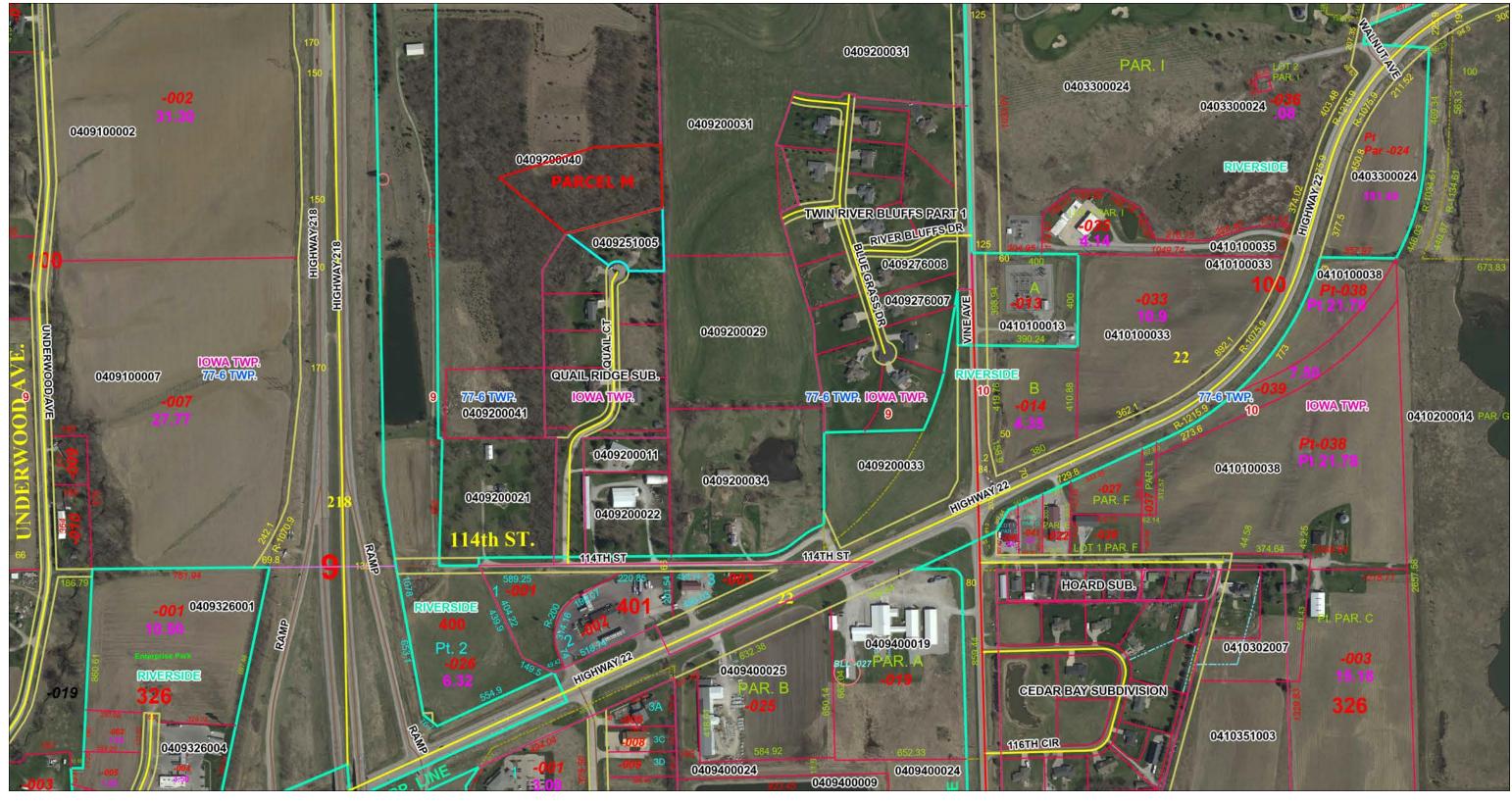
